Be Kind!

Warning, some people may wonder what this has to do with an Emmaus newsletter. This article is about being kind. Being kind is important in all that we do and the way we do it. What people remark the most about at the end of the walk has to do with love experienced through the kindness of others. We talk about how our fourth days will not be like the walk we just experienced, that while we have changed, the world has not so we need to be prepared.

But, what if we also focused on the Changing Our

BE KIND. ALWAYS. World talk (referred to as the COW talk)? What if, while the world itself may not have changed, we

have? What if we shared the kindness we have received, not just for a week or a month, but for the rest of our lives? What if we let the Holy Spirit work within us each day "to do justice, love kindness and walk humbly with God?" (Micah 6:8).

Being kind is sometimes very easy and sometimes very hard and we will fall short. If each and every day, though, we ask God to make us able to be kind, when it is easy and even when we are angry with someone, would that change our world? I have personally seen kindness be contagious, as I am sure most of you have also seen that. One of the kindest people I know, simply calls me and, if I cannot answer which is most times, she simply leaves me a message that she has prayed for me and to know that God loves me and so does she. She does this, not because she has to, but because she is kind. Even when she is angry and it might be hard, I have seen her be kind. I think we could change the world one person at a time by following this example and being kind to one another, not because someone will be kind back, but because you can show the love of God. Ephesians 4:32 states, "Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."
