QUESTIONS...

During the past few months there have been two questions that have been asked repeatedly of members of the Board of Directors: 1) Why is there now only one walk per year? 2) Why do we have to wait so long for walks #105 and #106?

I would like to answer those questions through this newsletter so the entire community will know the answers and hopefully understand.

Over the last few years TRWE has struggled as a community. Attendance at Gatherings and other functions has declined. We conducted a survey to try to improve Gathering attendance. We have tried some new things to increase Gathering participation, such as themed evenings. The August Gathering was our second annual all-music fest. For a community of our size it was disappointing to see only 35 people attending.

Unfortunately, this trend also is seen in walk preparation and supporting activities. Walk Lay Directors are finding it more difficult to find committed persons to be on teams. Often a complete team is not in place when teaming begins. Sometimes a full team isn't formed until the week of the walk which doesn't bode well for the pre-walk bonding experience.

Also there has been great difficulty in providing a full complement of pilgrims for a walk, especially for the men. This can lead to sponsors finding potential pilgrims right at the deadline who may not be ready to attend.

Finding Fourth Day help is also challenging – we always need servers, cleaning angels, agape makers, set up/tear down help and prayer vigil participants.

The Board of Directors decided to have one set of walks a year to see if it is easier for the community to get involved. This explains why we had a spring walk in 2018 and will hold a fall walk in 2019. For the women's walk, we had a full slate of 25 pilgrims. However for the men's walk we still struggled to get to at least a dozen. In hindsight, waiting 18 months between walks was not a good idea, but we wanted to determine if one season was more preferable over another.

We still plan on having one set of walks a year. However, having a walk at the same time each year may be a better solution. Knowing consistently when a walk will be held may help in planning and desiring to serve. We understand that perhaps it will be difficult for a future pilgrim to attend during a particular season. If the desire to be on a walk is strong, they will find a way to attend. Remember priority?

A walk needs the community for it to be successful. So we need your help. We have created a very short survey on your preference on when a walk should be held. This will help the board in planning future walks.
