Love Notes from Linda

I can clearly remember walking around with my head in the clouds for the nine months preceding my first daughter's birth. Then, suddenly, she was here, and I was holding her in my arms. I was overwhelmed with two feelings – the first was one of responsibility and the second was one of commitment.

As I begin my term as the Spiritual Director of the Western Pennsylvania Emmaus Community, I am overwhelmed with those same two feelings – responsibility and commitment.

Responsibility to each and every person who has completed the walk -- to be there for you and commitment to be my best for the community over this next year as it unfolds with surprises, delights, and concerns.

My hope is that each of you would see your position in the community with responsibility and commitment as well. It has been my experience since my pilgrimage that commitment, especially on walks, is sometimes dicey. We commit to being a part of a team that will make possible for another, *the very experience that we treasure*, but when we get down to the wire, we often find excuses to miss teamings and/or leave the weekend early.

I know that clergy sometimes have commitments that require an early departure. But each of us, clergy and laity alike, need to look hard at the commitment we face when we accept teaming responsibilities. We are responsible for the cost of the walk just as the pilgrims are, and that fee needs to be paid before the last teaming day. That has not been our experience in the past. As leaders in the community, we set the example. That is what leadership is all about – leading by example.

Our commitment to teaming is more than just showing up *prepared* on the scheduled teaming dates. It is being involved in a reunion group and attending gatherings as often as possible. It is staying in touch with the community at large and supporting those who are experiencing difficult times with an email, card, or phone call, and continued support of pilgrims from our teaming walks.

I'm excited about serving the community this coming year, and I hold the community in my arms and experience the same awe and reverence that I did when I first held my baby girl, Hallie. Some days I feel overwhelmed by the responsibility and commitment of being the Spiritual Director, but then I look around, and just as it was with my first baby, I see so many willing hands and hearts wanting to help, that it feels me with joy and delight and, yes, even excitement for our future. I promise to keep you all in prayer each day, and I covet your prayers as we journey together in 2006.

As we begin this New Year in partnership, let each of us remember what our Community stands for: Recommitment to Jesus Christ; we had our three-day course, and now our fourth-days are dedicated to bringing others to a higher commitment and fuller sense of responsibility in serving God through Jesus Christ. 


TRWE LOGO WEAR



I am a 21-year-old girl and I spend a lot of my time searching for what every other 21-year-old girl is looking for: love. The funny thing is I found the best love of my life when I was 15, when I went on my Chrysalis flight. The agape love I was shown that weekend was more amazing than anything I have experienced since. The love of Christ that was showered (onto tables and beds) before my eyes along with the caring hearts of the people around me was astounding. I remember thinking, “if these people love me this much and they don’t even know me, then I can’t imagine what God’s love must be like”.

The people I have met through Chrysalis, both that weekend and every Butterfly occasion since, are my family. Of course when I went on my Chrysalis flight I wasn’t looking for additions to my family, but there is such a special bond among the people attending that a “family” is the only way to describe it. I got a new dad (Christ) and a whole bunch of new brothers and sisters! By the third day I was calling the girls at my table “sister” and we still end our emails to each other with “love you sister”.

After our weekend we all had to go back to the real world and immediately everyone became busy with different things and we only saw each other a few times during the next couple of years. I hadn’t seen anyone in at least a year when it came time for my high school graduation party, but I sent them invitations just so they would know they were still important to me. It was a long drive and I knew how busy everyone was so I didn’t expect anyone to come. I remember my mom coming up to me at my party and asking me, “Heidi, who are those girls over there? I don’t remember them from school”. When I looked I saw three of my most beautiful butterfly sisters! I was so excited I ran over to them and we all had a great big group hug. They all apologized for not bringing me a gift or card, but I assured them that their presence was more than enough. That day I felt the love that I had first experienced on my weekend all over again.

I can recall one special moment from my weekend when the love of the people around me first “hit” me. I was sitting in the Chapel after Candlelight, a fire was in the fireplace and people were quietly sitting around the room. I was gazing into the flames of the fire and thinking about what had just happened and tears started streaming down my face. All those people, who didn’t even know me, drove long distances just to show me that they loved me and God loves me so much more. I remember the room being so cozy warm and feeling so comfortable and content and happy with myself: something I hadn’t felt in a long time.

Of course there were many other moments on the weekend that I will forever remember and that are just as important to me. That is why it’s hard for me to answer the inescapable Chrysalis question of: “what was your favorite part about your weekend?” After a lot of thought and many attempts to answer, I have finally come up with something to describe it: “It’s the unconditional agape love of Christ and His family that I was shown that weekend.”
