From The Community Spiritual Director

“Finally, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable – if anything is excellent or praiseworthy – think about such things.” Philippians 4:8

Paul ends his exhortations to his favorite church with these words. These are among his final instructions to those whom he has loved and will not see again. He is writing from prison. While there is no prison in my future (as far as I know), and I trust I will see you again soon, these are the words that came to my mind as I thought of writing to you for the last time as your Community Spiritual Director. It has been my blessing to serve you in this way for the past three years, and you have become more precious to me with each set of Walks and each passing year. I understand Paul’s love for those in his church and I understand his desire to want to leave them with words to live by. So I borrow his words as my parting words to you as Community SD.

One of the things we repeatedly hear from new Pilgrims is about the love they experienced on their Walk. That is what we hope they experience. But for it to be genuine, that love must be what we feel for one another. One of the ways that we keep that love real is to follow Paul’s instructions to the Philippians. The world is happy to tell us what is wrong, to point out the negative, to show the ugly and the evil. Just listen to the evening news or read the newspaper. The truth is that what we focus on what we see. We can focus on the negative of each other. We are sinful people, so the negative does exist. Or we can focus on the positive, as Paul suggests. Jesus calls us to be light in the midst of the darkness of the world. The best way to begin to be light is to focus our sights, our thoughts, our conversations on what is good – what is good in one another and what is good in the events in which we are involved. If we see the good, the noble, the right, the pure, the lovely in what those around us do, then the negative is much harder to see and becomes much less important. My prayer for us all is that we follow Paul’s instructions as we work together in Christ’s church and in Emmaus.

God bless you each in Christ’s love and grace.

Please label your Agape

1. with number of pieces you have brought. If the Agape is not counted, the Agape Team will need to count them to make sure there is enough to distribute.
2. with suggestion as to when you would like the Pilgrims to receive it (but Agape Team makes final decision).
3. with your name (or names of reunion groups or persons) so leftovers can be returned to you.

If you have written everyone's name on your Agape, please write on your note that the names are on them. Sometimes things are written small or are on the inside and the "poor overworked" Agape Teams miss the names at first sight so mistakes are made or things have to be re-gathered and distributed again. Also, please include a few extras without names so any last minute additions will also have your Agape.

Please, all Agape with names should be in alphabetical order: Team and Pilgrims separated.

If you would like to send Agape but you are unable to attend any weekend events, you can mail it to me and I will take it to the Walk.

Every effort will be made to return unused Agape. It will be laid out on Sunday in the Agape Room or Dining Room. Unused Agape will also be brought to the two Gatherings following the Walks. Please collect yours at either time.

Please have no gifts for individual Pilgrims, Team Members or tables. Agape should be showered on all Pilgrims equally. If you want to give a gift to your Pilgrim, spouse or your table, please wait until the trip home. Remember--no shirts, pins, beanie babies, flowers, etc.

A gape Letters for Sunday

Concerning the Letters collected by the sponsors for the Sunday Packet, to quote the Emmaus Model: "Personal Agape letters are powerful evidence to each Pilgrim that he or she is personally loved by those who know the Pilgrim best. For some, the personal Agape has the greatest impact of the Walk. Each sponsor has the responsibility of quietly requesting and collecting eight to twelve letters for the Pilgrim and delivering them to the Agape Team." (pg 66)

As we can see from the Model, the quality is more important than the quantity. For the good of all the Pilgrims, please adhere to the following points. Letters should be from close family members and good friends, though sometimes it is good to send a letter request to a friend or family member who lives far away. The purpose is to share the love of the people who are closest to them. The letter count of the rubber banded bundle should be between 8 and 15. These are the letters that the Pilgrims will be instructed to read first. The Pilgrims will not have time to read more than 15. If the Pilgrim has many Emmaus acquaintances, you can still request that they write a personal letter. They will be in the envelope but not in the bundle of 15. As Pilgrims pull out the bundle from the envelope, there should be a feeling of 'equality' as they begin to read the letters.

It can be difficult for a Pilgrim who has 8 personal letters to sit beside someone who pulls out a bundle of 40 letters. For some Pilgrims, it might be difficult for the sponsor to collect more than a few personal letters. If that is the case, the Agape Team will ask 4th Day workers to write general, but personal letters to those Pilgrims. Please bring your Pilgrim's letters with you Thursday night. If you will be bringing more letters to Candlelight, please let the Agape Team know. Short, love messages will be written by 4th Day volunteers for those Pilgrims who only have a few non-rubber banded letters in their envelopes.

Community:

You may still write a general but personal Agape letter of love to all the Pilgrims for the Sunday Packet. These are more personal if they are handwritten. If you print them on your computer, please consider typing in each person's name before you print them. (Include a few extra with no names.) This may take a bit longer, but will be more personal. If you want to send an inspirational writing to each Pilgrim with a name on it that is not letter of love; they should be labeled for Friday or Saturday bed-time bags.

Please make every effort to have personal letters to the Pilgrims and Speakers turned in early in the weekend. Speaker letters should have the person's name and talk title or the words "Speaker's Agape" on it. It is the only way the Agape Teams will know that the envelope is to be received before a Talk.

Snack Agape for Walks

Home made baking is always appreciated. Veggie and Fruit trays are desired to give a more nutritional snack. Some chips, pretzels and popcorn will be put out. Team members are asked to bring 2 2-liter bottles of soda or fruit drink.

**Duties of a Sponsor after the Walk**

**Step 7 Keep in contact with your candidates after the Walk. On the first days ask how their Fourth Day is going. A card or note with a cheerful Agape message is a loving personal touch. Make sure the persons you sponsored find a reunion group. If there is none available, start one. Invite them to attend the upcoming Mini-Gathering and Community Gatherings with you.**

Directions to Salvation Army's Camp Allegheny, Ellwood City, PA

From Pittsburgh Area and Turnpike East:

Route 79 north to Zelienople exit NEW 87 (OLD# 27): Go left at end of exit ramp. That's route 68. In 1.3 miles, at the light on Main Street, go straight. (route 68 signs point to turn left) Go to second stop sign turn left, one block, turn right at stop sign, This is 288 to Ellwood City. After crossing a new small bridge, bear to the right staying with 288. (Left at the Y is 588. You do not want that.) Giant Eagle and Ames are on the right in approx. 7 miles. At that light (Mercer Road) turn right. Go to end; at stop sign bear right. Cross one bridge with metal overhead supports. Cross next bridge. Wurtenburg UM Church is just before bridge. Immediately after bridge turn left onto Van Gorder Mill Road. Camp Allegheny is 7/10 of mile. CAUTION: Yield on one-lane bridge just before the camp.

From the North:

Route 79 south to Portersville exit NEW#96 (OLD#28): At the end of the exit ramp, turn left onto Route 488. In about a mile there is a stop sign and right merge onto route 19. (Portersville's Main Street) In less than ¼ mile, turn left, following signs for route 488. In about 7 miles you will go down a long hill. The road will cross a bridge. Turn right before the bridge onto Van Gorder Mill Road. Camp Allegheny is 7/10 of mile. CAUTION: Yield on one-lane bridge just before the camp.

From Butler County:

Route 422 west to South Shore (Moraine State Park) exit: At the end of the exit ramp, turn left. At the stop sign, turn right onto route 488. In about 3 miles right merge at the stop sign onto Route 19 (Portersville's Main Street). In less than ¼ mile, turn left, following signs for route 488. In about 7 miles you will go down a long hill. The road will cross a bridge. Turn right before the bridge onto Van Gorder Mill Road. Camp Allegheny is 7/10 of mile. CAUTION: Yield on one-lane bridge just before the camp.

From the West (Ohio) and Route 18

Take Turnpike Exit 2. Follow Route 18 north. At Al's Citco Station, turn right onto Route 351. Follow signs for 351. (left after RR tracks, left after long bridge.) At 5th Street in Ellwood, make a left turn. At second light, make a right turn, just before McDonald's. This street becomes Route 488 east. Cross two bridges with metalwork overhead. The third bridge is concrete. Immediately after third bridge, turn left onto Van Gorder Mill Road. Camp Allegheny is 7/10 of mile. CAUTION: Yield on one-lane bridge just before the camp.

From Route 60

Take Exit #17 for Route 351. As you cross Route 18 follow above directions.

From Route 65, (Baden, Freedom, Sewickley)

Take 65 north through New Brighton. As you get close to Ellwood City, you will see Trader Horn's on the left. At next light, turn right. At next light turn left onto Mercer Road. Go to the stop sign and bear right. Cross one bridge with metal overhead supports. Cross next bridge. Wurtenburg UM Church is just before bridge. Immediately after bridge turn left onto Van Gorder Mill Road. Camp Allegheny is 7/10 of mile. CAUTION: Yield on one-lane bridge just before the camp.



From Betty Scott Assistant Lay Director

We are in the process of applying to the State of Pennsylvania for sales tax exemption status. The Department of Revenue of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania will not grant this status to us without an amendment to our by-laws that “SPECIFICALLY INCLUDES A PROVISION PROHIBITING THE USE OF ANY SURPLUS FUNDS FOR PRIVATE INUREMENT TO ANY PERSON IN THE EVENT OF A SALE OR DISSOLUTION OF THE INSTITUTION”

Based on that requirement, the Board of Directors of TRWE submit the following amendment to our by-laws.

ARTICLE X – SALE OR DISSOLUTION OF THREE RIVERS WALK TO EMMAUS COMMUNITY

In the event of sale or dissolution of the community, after all obligations are satisfied, the remainder of funds must be donated to a sister community that is in good standing with the International Emmaus Movement, The Upper Room, Nashville, Tennessee, The United Methodist Church, and shall operate in accordance with its directives and guidelines. Three Rivers Walk to Emmaus will request the funds be directed to a struggling or start up community. TRWE prohibits the use of any surplus funds for private inurement to any person.

In accordance with Article VIII – Amendments of the Three Rivers Walk to Emmaus Restated By-laws, this change must be circulated to the membership. If no petitions signed by at least 25 Community members objecting to the new amendment are received, the amendment will be considered adopted. Any objection must be received within 60 days of the notification.
