Baptism: does it mean what we think it means?

One of my favorite movies of all time is Princess Bride. It is the story of a girl named Buttercup who lives on a farm. Buttercup took great delight in tormenting the hired help, a boy named Wesley. No matter what demands Buttercup made on Wesley he always answered her, "As you wish."

Eventually Buttercup found herself falling in love with Wesley. Wesley, realizing that he had no way to support Buttercup, set off into the world to seek his fortune. Word got back to Buttercup that Wesley and his entire ship had been captured by the dread Pirate Roberts who was known to take no prisoners.

While Buttercup was grieving the loss of her beloved Wesley, her beauty was noticed by Prince Humperdink. The Prince proposed and Buttercup finally accepted, thinking that since her beloved was dead, she might as well.

But, unbeknownst to Buttercup, the evil Prince Humperdink didn't really want to marry Buttercup. He hired Vizzini, a man of diabolical and dizzying intellect to kidnap the princess and kill her, making it look as though the neighboring country is responsible. The Prince wanted to go to war and expand his empire.

Vizzini and his men kidnapped the Buttercup and sailed away. While they were on the ship, one of the men kept looking behind him. Vizzini asked, "What are you looking for?" The man said that he is looking to see if anyone is following them. Vizzini answered that that would be *Inconceivable*. No one knew what they had done.

The man continued to look behind him and said, "Are you sure no one is following us?" Vizzini once again said "As I told you it would be absolutely, totally and in all other ways, *Inconceivable!*" It turned out that a man in black WAS following them. Against all odds he caught up to them and as Vizzini and his men climbed the steep Cliffs of Insanity with Buttercup as their prisoner, the man in black continued to follow behind them.

Vizzini looked down and said, "*Inconceivable!*" Vizzini then cut the rope they used to climb up the cliff- the rope that the man in black is now using to climb up the cliff. Vizzini throws the rope over the cliff. The men look down, expecting to see the man in black smashed to pieces on the rocks below-but all is not lost. The man in black is hanging on.

Vizzini peered over the cliff and said, "He didn't fall? *Inconceivable!*" One of his men said, "You keep using that word. I do not think it means what you think it means!"

How many times do we use a word, not realizing what it means? How many of us can explain *baptism*? Why do we *baptize*? Why did Jesus need to be *baptized* if He was without sin? How does *baptism* relate to our Emmaus community? "You keep using that word, I do not think it means what you think it means!"

Baptism always seems to cause problems. The first time it was a problem was when Jesus came to be baptized by John. After all, if Jesus was the Messiah, why in the world would he need to be baptized by John? *Inconceivable!*

John tried to prevent Jesus by protesting. He told Jesus: "I'm the one who should be baptized by you, and yet you come to be baptized by me?" Jesus explained to John- and to us- that he wanted to be baptized-that this was a temporary condition and in this way "fulfill all righteousness."

So why is Jesus baptized at all?

If we connect baptism to forgiveness of sin, and if Jesus is the sinless Son of God, why would he need to be baptized? *Inconceivable!* **Rev. Cindy Parker, CSD TRWE #64**

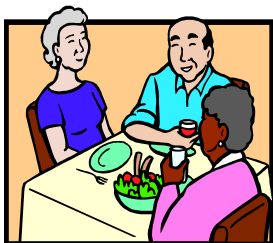
MEMORIAL SERVICE

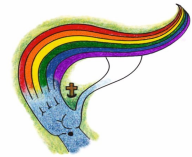
