The scripture from Acts is a description of how the early disciples grew after the day of Pentecost. This holds the key to the growth of the church as well. They ate together, and for them that usually involved communion and finally, they were committed to prayer. music, worship, communion and a time of fellowship!


This is the shelter above the shelter that was used for the last two picnics.
